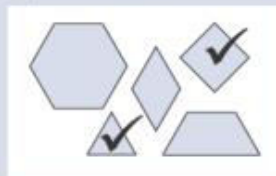

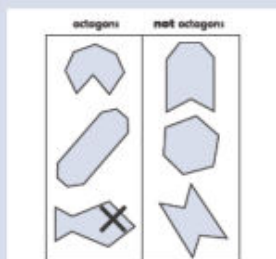
Accept any other clear way of indicating the triangle and the square, eg joining them with a line.
